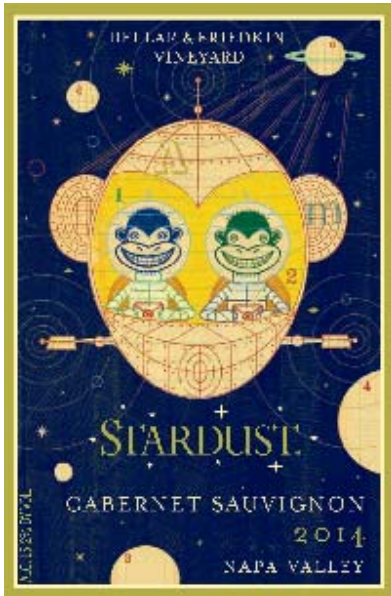

VARIETY WHITES

Inspired by Sauvignon Blanc produced in either the Loire Valley or Bordeaux regions of France, producers of California Sauvignon Blanc have evolved two predominant styles of wine. Most producers, by utilizing a variety of wine growing and wine making techniques, have been successful in muting the intense varietal grassiness of Sauvignon Blanc and are producing either a lighter, crisper, fruity style wine or a much rounder, fuller, more complex one. It is one of the most versatile and food friendly wines made.

CHARDONNAY

California Chardonnays are generally regarded as among the best dry white wines produced. The best tend to be fruity (apple, citrus, tropical), balanced by good acidity. Adjectives such as buttery, spicy, smokey and toasty often seem appropriate.

As Chardonnays age, they become more golden in color, and soften to develop complex notes of nuts or butterscotch.

PINOT NOIR

The best Pinot Noir, like the best Chardonnay, grows in cool areas: Russian River, Carneros, and the Santa Ynez and Santa Maria Valleys south of the Bay Area. In each case cold Pacific fog bathes the vineyards each night. These cool growing areas allow the grapes to retain high acidity, and to mature and develop slowly. Pinot Noir flavors are subtle. A grape that matures slowly is said to have had a long hang time. This is just one of the many contributors to the best quality Pinot Noir.

SYRAH

Syrah: the mother of all Rhone grape varieties. Syrah is the only grape used to make the famous Rhone wines of Cote Rotie and Hermitage, but also forms the backbone of most Rhone blends, including the ever-so-enchancing Chateauf-du-Pape.

More than half the world's total Syrah acreage is planted in France, but it is also a successful grape in Australia (called Shiraz), South Africa and California. Syrah forms intense wines with deep violet, nearly black color; chewy texture and richness, and often with aromas that tend to be more spicy than fruity - a great alternative to Cabernet Sauvignon or Merlot!

During their youth, Cabernet Sauvignons typically are rich, tannic and full bodied showing characteristics of currants, black cherries, herbs, green olives, cedar, mint, tar and bell pepper.

Over time, tannins soften and complex flavors and aromas blend together, developing qualities of tobacco leaf, tea, leather and truffles.

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CABERNET SAUVIGNON & BLENDS

Appellation, or where the grapes are grown, plays a vital role in the ultimate quality of the resulting wine. While top quality Cabernet Sauvignon is produced throughout California, Napa Valley has established itself as the premier cabernet sauvignon producing appellation. Within Napa there are many sub-appellations, microclimates, and single vineyards producing excellent cabernet sauvignon of varying weight and intensity.

RUTHERFORD: typically shows deep, complex berry fruit flavors with balanced acidity and tannin.

OAKVILLE: rich, ripe flavors of cassis, mint and cedar.

STAGS LEAP: a soft and supple character with plum and cherry flavors.

CALISTOGA: rich and intense with elements of earth and dark chocolate.

The mountain areas of MT. VEEDER AND HOWELL MOUNTAIN: typically dark, deep, intense, and tannic.
